## SERVICE AREA

16 counties in Northeast and North Central Florida: Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Clay, Columbia, Dixie, Duval, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Lafayette, Levy, Nassau, Putnam, St. Johns, Suwannee and Union.

## PATIENTS

Our palliative and hospice care teams serve people of any age with any advanced illness or condition, including but not limited to: dementia, congestive heart failure, Parkinson's disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease), cancer and/or complications of AIDS.

## LOCATIONS

- Our main office is in Jacksonville at 4266 Sunbeam Road (Mandarin).
- Our administrative offices are on Jacksonville's Northside and in Gainesville, Lake City, Palatka, Fernandina Beach, Fleming Island and St. Augustine.
- We offer hospice care in a variety of settings, including: patients' homes, long-term care and assisted living communities, hospitals and our ten inpatient Centers for Caring:

  - **Dr. Gaston J. Acosta-Rua Center for Caring**, a 10-bed center on Ramona Boulevard on Jacksonville's Westside
  - **Anne and Donald McGraw Center for Caring**, a 16-bed center on the Mayo Clinic Florida west campus near Jacksonville's Beaches communities
  - **Center for Caring at Ascension St. Vincent's Riverside**, a 10-bed center on the 4th floor at Ascension St. Vincent's Hospital in Jacksonville
  - **Center for Caring at Ascension St. Vincent's Southside**, an 8-bed center on the 5th floor of Ascension St. Vincent's Southside Hospital in Jacksonville
  - **Bailey Family Center for Caring**, a 12-bed center on the campus of Flagler Hospital in St. Augustine
  - **Jane and Bill Warner Center for Caring**, an 8-bed center on the campus of Baptist Medical Center Nassau in Fernandina Beach

## OUR SERVICES & PROGRAMS

Community Hospice & Palliative Care provides compassionate care and knowledgeable guidance at every step of the journey. Our hospice care services include:

- In-home nursing care
- Physician services
- Palliative care
- Psychosocial services
- Spiritual support
- Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)/home health aide services
- Volunteer support
- Medical equipment and supplies
- Medications for symptom management and/or pain relief related to the terminal condition
- Bereavement counseling and support

- Music, speech, massage, and pet therapies
- Dietary counseling
- Special services, if needed:
  - Short-term inpatient care
  - Short-term respite care
  - Specialized care for veterans
  - Specialized care for those of the Jewish faith

- Pet therapy services

## ELIGIBILITY

- Patients are eligible for hospice care when they show symptoms of advanced illness and are diagnosed with a life expectancy of 12 months or less (six months for Medicare coverage).
- To receive hospice care, a patient must have a physician's order, patient/family consent and residency within our service area.
- Patients of any age and at any stage of a serious, life-threatening illness may be eligible for palliative care services.

## PAYMENT

- In most cases, palliative and hospice services are paid for by Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance.
- If patients and families have no means to pay, care is funded through contributions raised by Community Hospice & Palliative Care Foundation (see reverse for more information).
- No one is denied care based on inability to pay.
